Ideas to Grow Your Preschooler's Faith at Home

Love is...

*It's February.
Time for Valentine's Day.
Romance. Friendship. Love.*

*A*s your child points out the pink and red hearts everywhere, you stop for a minute to ponder. What does love really look like on a day-to-day basis for you and your preschool child?

Consider the words of 1 Corinthians 13:4-7, interpreted with today's child and parent in mind. The first section is written with application points for your child. The second part is written for parents.

Little child, love is patient. Love doesn't tug hard on Mom's arm when she stops to talk to that tall lady with glasses at church. Love waits quietly at the table while Dad scoops ice cream into the bowl.

Little child, love is kind. Love says "please" and "thank-you." Love lets her little sister take a turn playing the jelly jumping jackrabbit game on Dad's phone.

Little child, love doesn't sulk jealously all day when his older brother gets a better Christmas gift from Grandma.

Little child, love doesn't make all her friends play the game SHE wants to play and then brag about her big win.

Little child, love doesn't tell Mom NO when she says it's time to clean up, or start kicking toys angrily around the room.

Little child, let God and your parents teach you how to love!

Now for you, **preschool parent**. You already know that love often means putting your child's needs above your own. Love also means refusing to

harbor resentment when your child responds to you with anything but gratefulness.

Preschool parent, love doesn't keep thinking about your child's sins. It never counts the times your child disobeys.

Neither does love laugh at your child's "white" lies or take secret pleasure in giving your child the punishment she deserves; rather love rejoices to see your child taking steps to trust Christ as Savior and follow His ways each day.

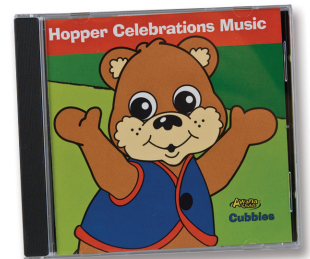
Above all, love sees the best in your child, praying and hoping for the day he will become a mature, godly adult.
